Each student who enrolls at the Winter Sports School in Park City is required to accept the responsibility of ethical, honest standards in his or her academic life by signing a copy of the code.

Intellectual integrity is the foundation of academic pursuit. There are assignments that require group effort; however, the representation of another's work as your own or an unfair use of another person's materials constitutes a breach of that integrity.

Plagiarism occurs whenever one uses another person's words or ideas and presents them as one's own. This includes taking verbal, printed, or artistic sources and including them within the work as if one were the originator. One may use other people's words, ideas, and illustrations only with proper acknowledgment, citations, and a works cited page.

Consequences of violating the honor code

First offense: No credit on the work, faculty informed, and parents notified by the Dean of Students. The student will be given on-site counseling.

Second offense: Class failed, parents notified, and student given additional counseling.

Third offense: Student is subject to expulsion at the discretion of the Head of School.
